☐ Choose a business name and check for availability - Your nonprofit corporation's name may not be the same as other corporate names on file with the Secretary of State.

Search the Ohio corporate filings database to determine name availability.

# ☐ Recruit and/or appoint directors

- You must have at least three directors for your nonprofit corporation.
- Directors do not have to reside within Ohio, nor do they have to be of a certain age.
- The Ohio Attorney General has a <u>Guide for Board Members</u> which explains the duties and responsibilities that directors owe to a nonprofit organization.

# ☐ Incorporate your Nonprofit Organization

## ☐ Prepare and file articles of incorporation with the Secretary of State

- <u>Start a Nonprofit in Ohio</u> explains what to include in your articles in order to qualify for 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status.
- You must file your articles of incorporation with the Ohio Secretary of State. Use Form 532B.
- The filing fee is \$99.
- As part of the form, you must appoint a Statutory Agent.

## ☐ Create the bylaws

- There are no set criteria for the content of bylaws, but they typically set forth internal rules and procedures.
- You are not required to file bylaws with the Secretary of State, but you must keep a copy at the nonprofit corporation's principal place of business.

## ☐ Create a Records Book

 You will need a records book to store important documents concerning your nonprofit corporation. See <u>Ohio Rev. Code § 1702-15</u> for specific information about record-keeping requirements under Ohio law.

☐ **Get your Employer Identification Number -** Whenever you hire an employee in Ohio, you must inform both the IRS and the state of Ohio.

- Request an Employer Identification Number ("EIN") from the IRS. This can be done via an online application.

# ☐ Ohio Attorney General

- Before engaging in any solicitation activities, you must register with the Attorney General by filing the Charitable Organization Registration Form.
- The filing fee depends on the nonprofit corporation's estimated contributions for the coming year.
- The fee is waived for nonprofit corporations with estimates less than \$25,000. The filing fee is \$50 those with estimates between \$25,000 and \$100,000.

## □ Other

- Ohio law requires every nonprofit corporation to keep its statutory agent information current. In the event the name or address of a company's statutory agent changes, or the statutory agent resigns or dies, the entity must choose a new statutory agent and submit the Statutory Agent Update (Form 521) and filing fee of \$25.00.
- Every five years, a nonprofit corporation must file a Statement of Continued Existence (Form 522) with the Ohio Secretary of State's office.
